Spotlight on learning

Each week we will share some of the learning that has been happening in each year group and how the children have been impressing the adults in school.

Year 3 – Year 3 have been learning about including everyone in PSHE and about not being a bystander. Children are now using different retrieval techniques in reading lessons to answer questions. Children's understanding of the purposes of bones is developing.

Year 4 – The teachers and children are really excited about the children's writing outcomes. There is great progress so far in all classes in writing and the children are keen to write. In science, children are recalling prior learning about electricity and circuits. They are also excited about making mittens in DT.

Year 5 - Writing is a real positive across all classes and children are very eager to write, often coming in asking when they will be writing that day! Children are very keen about science and are learning lots of facts and information about space.

The children are also asking lots of questions.

Year 6 – The children are using TinkerCAD for computing and enjoying making their designs. Some children have said they using their codes at home. In PSHE, children are linking class discussions to what they talk about in assembly, including discussions about everyone being welcome, especially on the playground.

National Online Safety: Microtransactions

Seventy-six billion dollars! That's the value some experts have assigned to this year's global online microtransaction market – those additional in-app and in-game purchases which offer young players a temptingly quick way to enhance their digital experience for real-world money.

With concerns over the impact of allowing these paid-for upgrades to be available to children, some countries have already either banned microtransactions or subjected them to stringent legislation. This week's guide outlines the most significant risks.

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about

Microtransactions (often abbreviated as "MTX") are digital purchases made within an app or game to unlock extra features or additional content such as new levels. A popular sub-set of these are loot boxes, which contain a selection (usually random) of virtual items: from character skins to game-changing equipment like better weapons. Microtransactions (and loot boxes in particular) are now widespread in apps and games, but concerns persist that they normalise gambling and can loster addictive behaviours — especially among younger players.




