Spotlight on learning

Each week we will share some of the learning that has been happening in each year group and how the children have been impressing the adults in school.

Year 3

The teachers in Y3 are really impressed with how confident the children are becoming with their multiplication tables and it has been great to see them making links between the 4 and 8 timetables. They have been exploring different strategies and mathematical language too. In design and technology, the children are enjoying designing a working toy amusement park.

The children are learning how to use Lego and program it with the iPads.

Year 4

The children have enjoyed writing diaries linked to their class text- The Ice Palace. In design and technology, the children are busy practising the running stitch in preparation for making their mittens in the coming weeks. In music, the children have been playing glockenspiels and practising using two beaters.

Year 5

Children in Y5 are realising how important multiplications are as they continue to persevere with fractions. In geography, the children are learning about the continent of South America and the rainforest. They have been using technical vocabulary to talk about biomes.

Year 6

The children are using great vocabulary choices in their writing. They are really enjoying their DT unit where they have been designing cushions. We are all looking forward to seeing their finished products.
